With its own offices in Brazil, Uruguay, Argentina, Chile, Peru, Colombia, Mexico and Costa Rica, and a team of over 250 employees and collaborators, all moved by passion. WAIVER carried a record volume of more than 8,500 tons of equipment, such as broadcast equipment, musical instruments, scenery, tents, competition vehicles, timing equipment and many others, to some of the greatest events on the planet. In order to meet all this demand, our team of experts used more than 1,000 load trucks.



Once again, F1 contributed so as we could achieve this new record. In order to attend the event, WAIVER, as the Official and Exclusive Logistics Operator of the F1 Grand Prix in Mexico and Brazil, mobilized, simultaneously, for more than 30 days, two distinct and dedicated teams, comprising more than 50 of our talents, aiming to ensure the complete success of the complex logistics operation of Formula 1. Whether it is in Mexico or in Brazil our tasks are accomplished with excellence!

After a month of mobilization, Waiver team accomplished two large events of great responsibility. One of them in Mexico and the other in Sao Paulo. Two great tasks achieved.

Despite the title had already been decided after the victory of Lewis Hamilton in the United States, Formula 1 2015 was a great success wherever the event took place. Nico Rosberg stepped up the podium first followed by Lewis Hamilton, his Mercedes teammate, in both Interlagos and Hermanos Rodriguez circuits. Sebastian Vettel, Ferrari, shared the podium.

In Sao Paulo, Lewis Hamilton payed tribute to Ayrton Senna by wearing a helmet in the colors of the Brazilian flag and the symbol of the Ayrton Senna Institute. In fact, Hamilton's relationship with the country goes beyond his

admiration for the former pilot since, in 2008, he became the world champion for the first time in the country.

The relationship between Waiver and Formula 1 stands, year after year, with commitment and agility to perform the fastest sporting event in the world.

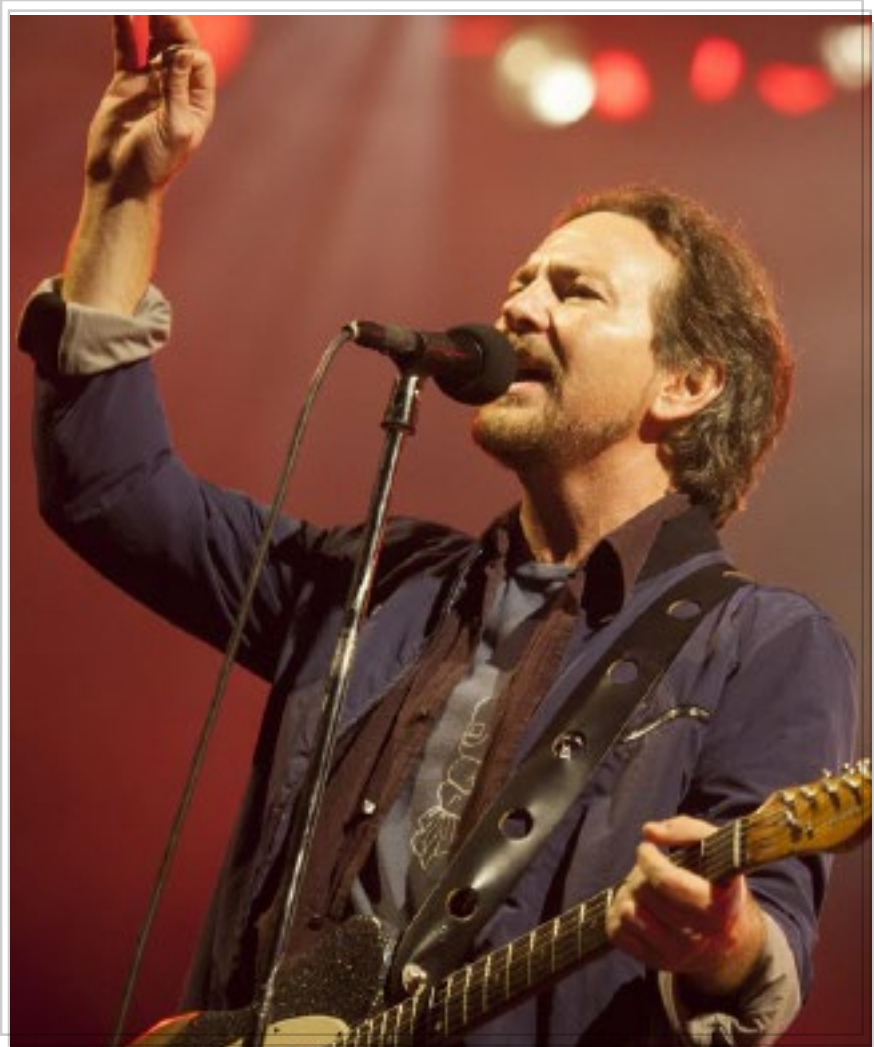


In order to attend the event, we used six Boeing Freighters 747 and more than 200 sea containers of 40 feet. The most critical part of the operation was moving more than 100 shipments of import and export, on commercial flights originating from various Countries of the World, with special emphasis on England, Italy, Germany, cradles of F1, and Ferrari and Mercedes, respectively. The logistics precision required by Formula 1 asks for a lot of experience and talent, ingredients that are already part of the history of Waiver.

Sh Pearl Jam

The American rock band Pearl Jam toured in Brazil in November, promoting their 10th studio album, *Lightning Bolt*, launched in 2013. The work has been awarded a Grammy, debuted at number one on the Billboard and iTunes in over 50 countries.

Pearl Jam's performance in Brazil is worthy of being interpreted as a historical, not only by the energy of the gray haired quintet, but mainly for all the causes the band defended during their performances. At the opening of the shows, the short film "Floresta" (Forest) interpreted by journalist Pedro Bial was displayed as a way to get the audience to reflect on environmental issues. The band announced investments in carbon mitigation projects in South America and environmental conservation of forests in Brazil. Besides all that, they donated the money they earned with their show in Belo Horizonte to the victims of the disaster that occurred in Mariana, city of the state of Minas Gerais-Brazil.

The tour that started in Porto Alegre (Arena do Grêmio - November 11) passed by São Paulo (Morumbi Stadium - November 14), Brasília (Mane Garrincha Stadium - November 17), Belo Horizonte (Mineirao Stadium - November 20) and ended in Rio de Janeiro (Maracana Stadium - November 22) with a crowded house and warm audience. Eddie Vedder even invited a fan to take the stage and near the end of the show, he broke one of his guitars to the delight of the crowd.

Waiver accompanied the band throughout the tour in Brazil. 40,000Kg of equipment were transported in six load trucks, which were exported to Bogota on a charter flight.

Waiver managed the temporary import of 1,984 kg of equipment that were re-exported to Argentina after the presentations in Brazil that took place in Rio de Janeiro November 27 and in Sao Paulo November 29 during the Sonar electronic music festival.

sh Morrissey

Steven Patrick Morrissey, also known as Morrissey, is a British singer and composer. He is 56 and was the lead singer of the English rock band The Smiths.

Morrissey performed at Renault Theater on November 17, at Citibank Hall (São Paulo) on November 21, at Metropolitan (Rio de Janeiro) on November 24 and in Brasilia on November 29. The "World peace is none of your business" tour will go to Paraguay, Uruguay, Argentina and Peru. The singer was in Brazil twice, in 2000 and 2012. In 2013, he had to cancel the tour because of health problems.

Morrissey is vegetarian since the age of 11 and was honored by PETA for fighting for the animal rights. The singer often criticizes people who publicly defend the consumption of meat and his position has already put him in unusual situations such as the one when he left the stage at Coachella festival in 2009 after smelling cooking meat.

sh Banyu Inryoku

The Japanese theater group Banyu Inryoku returned to Brazil after 20 years. On the first visit, in 1995, the group presented the play named "Suna" at SESC Anchieta and SESC Santos Theaters, on the celebrations of 100 years of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation Brazil-Japan. This time, in order to celebrate the 120th Anniversary of the Treaty of Friendship, the group will present the play "Nuhi Kun" (Instructions to Servants). It is a new production and a retrospective of Shuji Terayama, one of the most important artists of the vanguard that was and still is the inspiration and teacher of the group and its director, J.A Seazer.



Founded over 30 years ago, the Banyu Inryoku group mix circus elements, martial arts, Noh and Kabuki reinterpretations of punk-rock, popular culture, ritual theater, surrealism mimes, experimental opera and other references.

"The group often use visual language and plenty of lighting, with little text and is therefore easily understood", explains the photographer and coordinator of the group coming to Brazil, Yuji Kusuno.

There were presentations in Mirandópolis (SP) on November 13 at Yuba Theater, on November 21 and 22, at SESC Santos Theater and 2 shows at SESC Pinheiros Theater, on November 28 and 29.

SESC Pinheiros, in São Paulo, held the show "Solos (Seuls)", with text, direction and interpretation of Wajdi Mouawad, actor, director, author and artistic director. The presentations took place on November 5, 6 and 7.

In this performance, Wajdi Mouawad questions what happens to his mother tongue when all starts happening in another language - a second language, acquired. The character is Harwan, Montreal student who is about to defend his thesis and is stuck in the Hermitage Museum in St. Petersburg, where he questions about the meaning of life, roots, values and culture.

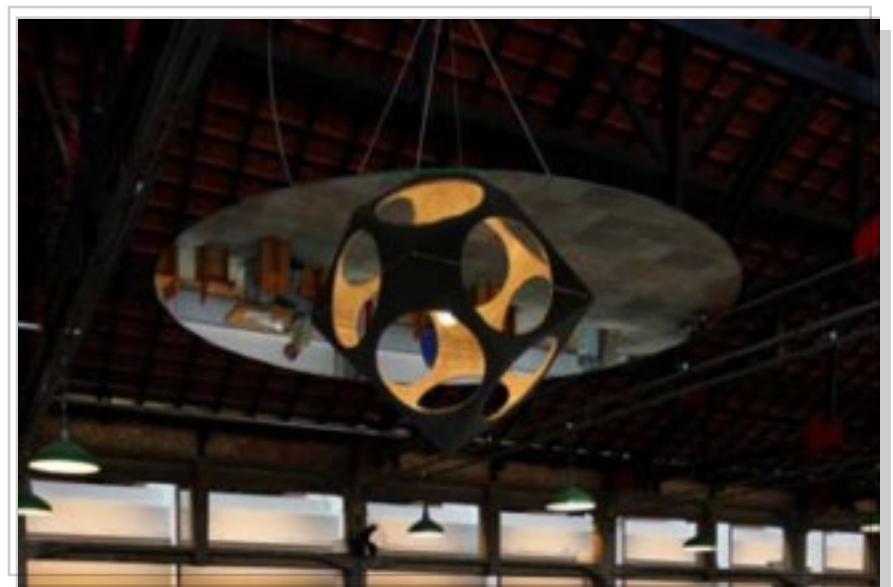
